

Medal to veterans at her office in Loveland, 5401 Stone Creek Circle, No. 204.

To be eligible for the medal, veterans must meet the following qualifications:

- Served between June 25, 1950 and July 27, 1953.

- Had been on permanent assignment or on temporary duty for 30 consecutive days or 60 nonconsecutive days.

- Performed their duty within the territorial limits of Korea, in the waters immediately adjacent to or in aerial flight over Korea, participating in actual combat operations or in support of combat operations.

Veterans of the Korean War should contact Musgrave's office to apply for this medal. Veterans must provide a copy of their discharge paper, commonly known as a DD-214, or a corrected version of that document, a DD-215. National Guard members must provide their statement of service equivalent, NGB Form 22.

Rep. Musgrave to honor Korean War veterans

WASHINGTON — U.S. Rep. Marilyn Musgrave announced plans to recognize veterans of the Korean War during a medal ceremony next month.

Musgrave, a Republican from the state's 4th Congressional District, will hold the ceremony from 1 to 3 p.m., Nov. 8 at her Loveland office.
